

Carol Elliott Art Day and More at the Plymouth Historical Society

In memory of Carol Elliot of Plymouth, the Plymouth Historical Society will be hosting an Art Sale on Saturday, May 14th from 10-1 pm. Items will include framed pictures to decorative items for kitchen use, walls and more. These treasures were donated by an anonymous donor. For folks who did not know Carol, the following is a brief summary of this incredible woman. Carol came to Plymouth to attend Plymouth Teacher's College. Upon graduation, she married Donald Elliott in 1961. "Carol held numerous elected positions in Grafton County government. She began her career as Town Clerk of Plymouth from 1969 until 1986. She served in positions as the Secretary and Treasurer of the Grafton County Republican Committee for approximately 30 years, from the 1980s until 2013. In addition, Carol was the Registrar of Deeds in Grafton County from 1987 until her retirement in 2002. She was elected to the office of Grafton County Treasurer from 2003 until 2012. After retiring, she was elected to a commissioner's post for the Plymouth Village Water & Sewer Department. Then, she was elected to the Treasurer position for the Plymouth Village Water & Sewer Dept. She held this post until she passed away." Beyond her numerous professional positions, Carol had a passion for decorative painting. For years, she taught classes to many in her studio located next to her home. So many of these learners became great friends for a lifetime. Although Carol passed away in December of 1977 at the age of 77, she is still remembered for her talent that was shared with many over the years.
